A list of all of the web domains (URLs) and IP addresses that are part of a block list due to the Council Decision 2022/351/CFSP from 2nd of March 2022. If there is a public, maintained list of these resources, please provide me with a link to it as well. Has your institution sought any action against these IP addresses and web domains? Which institutions are responsible for implementing the activities against these IP addresses and web domains? Which institutions are responsible for overseeing the implementation of these activities? Which mechanisms are used to implement these block lists (for example DNS blocks, IP blocks)? Which institutions are implementing which mechanisms?* – received by the Ministry of Interior on the 29th of September 2022, I send the following reply.

Regarding to the requested data pursuant to Section 3(9) of Act CXII of 2011 on the Right to Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information (hereinafter: Infotv.) the Ministry of Interior is not a data controller.

In the event of a refusal to comply with your data request, you may apply to the court pursuant to Article 31 (1) of the Infotv. or to the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information pursuant to Article 52 (1).
